- Divisions:** Men's and Women's
- Entry Procedure:** Soccer entries will be accepted in the Recreational Services office Thursday, August 27 through Thursday, September 3. The office is located in the entrance lobby of the Recreation Complex. Entries will be accepted from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Prior to sign-up, check the soccer schedule menu on the reverse side of this sheet for available league times. Decide, along with your team members, on an acceptable play time. In the men's division, it is best to have a second choice as well. Eligibility rules are printed in the Intramural Sports Program Handbook and are available in the Recreational Services office. If needed, you may find a team to participate with or additional players for your team by using the team/player wanted board posted in the intramural gallery at the Recreation Complex.
- Play:** Soccer teams will be organized into leagues and play will be round robin. Games will be played on the intramural play fields north of the Recreation Complex. Each team with a winning percentage of .500 or better will advance to playoffs, with the following exceptions: 1) teams that forfeit twice during the season or forfeit once and did not attend the soccer captain's meeting, 2) teams that use players playing under an assumed name, 3) teams that violate team probation. It is the team's responsibility to check the playoff schedule at the Recreation Complex.
- Play Begins:** Thursday, September 10
- Meeting:** A mandatory captain's/manager's meeting will be held Wednesday, September 9, at 5 p.m. at the Recreation Complex. Each team must be represented at this meeting. Teams not represented at this meeting are put on probation and one forfeit, for any reason, will drop the team from the remainder of the schedule. We will discuss league and tournament play, new policies governing intramural soccer, rules, etc. Intramural soccer schedules will also be available at this meeting.
- Forfeits:** Team captains/managers will be responsible for paying forfeit fines. A "no-show" forfeit fine of \$20 shall be imposed on team managers who fail to notify the Director of Intramurals in writing 24 hours prior to a scheduled contest that they will not field a team. Refer to the forfeits section of the Intramural Sports Program Handbook for more information.
- Points:** Intramural team points will be compiled.
- Awards:** Awards will be given to the overall winning team in each division.
- Entry Fee:** \$20 per team (\$21.46 with tax) to be paid at sign-up.
- Additional Information:** If the weather is questionable, call Rec Check at 785-532-6000 one hour prior to the scheduled game time. Rules, field maps, and additional information are available in the Recreational Services office.

Assumption of Risk

K-State Recreational Services does its best to provide a safe environment for your activities. You are responsible for making good choices. Injuries could include, but are not limited to, temporary or permanent muscle soreness, sprains, strains, cuts, abrasions, bruises, ligament and/or cartilage damage, head, neck or spinal injuries, loss of use of arms and/or legs, eye damage, disfigurement, or even death. By your voluntary participation, you assume all risk of injuries. Take responsibility. Do not take risks or do activities that may not be appropriate for you. Ask questions. If you have any questions about your health and how it might be affected by exercise or other activities in the facilities/programs, contact your doctor and obtain his/ her permission before doing them. A complete physical is recommended. Have insurance. If you are injured, your own personal medical insurance must be sufficient to cover your needs. K-State and Recreational Services assumes no responsibility of costs involved with individual injury or property damage or loss incurred in connection with the use of university facilities/programs. Pay attention to your surroundings. Be aware of the presence of others while you participate. Do not engage in activities that could injure others. You should report any unusual significant hazard during your presence or participation, remove yourself from participation, and bring such to the attention of the nearest staff. Protect your personal property. If you bring your belongings, you are responsible for their care and safety. They could be lost, stolen, or damaged. Contact Recreational Services staff at once if an accident, injury or related incident occurs!
